
Every child has the right to learn

been focussing on the children's right to learn. In school, the children discuss the characteristics of a good learner, how they learn best and are encouraged to take control of their own learning. The children are shown how they can respect this right by trying their best, persevering and helping others. We also have discussions about the fact that there are some children in the world whose right to learn is not met and the effect this has on their lives.

What do you like learning about?

This right is stated in 'The United Nations Convention for the Rights of the Child':

Article 28 (right to education): Every child has the right to an education. Primary education must be free.

Secondary education must be available to every child. Discipline in schools must respect children's dignity. Richer countries must help poorer countries achieve this.
