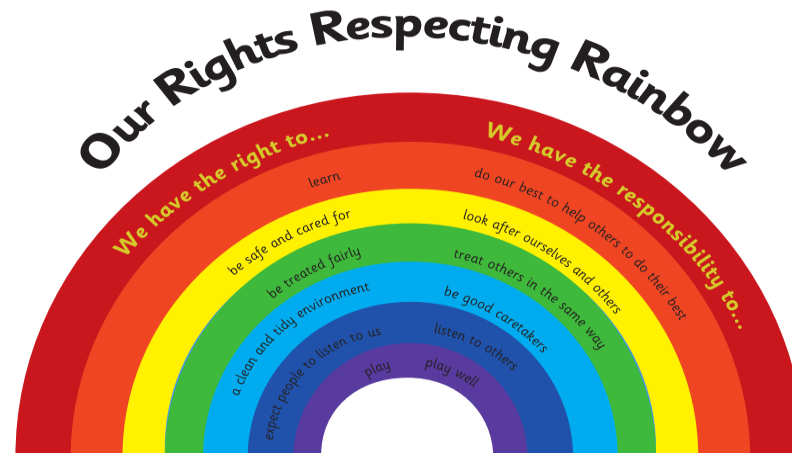


Every child has the right to be treated fairly

Every half term we focus on a different right from our 'Rights Respecting Rainbow'. This half term we will be focussing on the children's right to be treated fairly. Through assemblies and class discussions the children are taught that we are all different, and that it is important to respect and celebrate these differences by ensuring that we treat everyone in the same way. The children discuss ways of treating everyone fairly, for example, making sure that everyone has a turn in a game or that fruit is shared out equally.

This right is stated in 'The United Nations Convention for the Rights of the Child':
Article 2

All children have these rights, no matter who they are, where they live, what their parents do, what language they speak, what their religion is, whether they are a boy or girl, what their culture is, whether they have a disability, whether they are rich or poor. No child should be treated unfairly on any basis.
