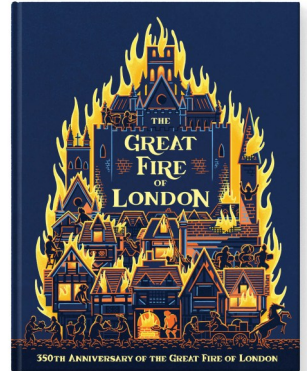


# Fire! Fire!

This half term we will be learning how to keep ourselves safe and our whole school focus is the right to be safe and cared for.

We will learn about The Great Fire of London using this book:  
We will use drama and role play activities to help us remember what happened. We have Perform Drama group coming on the 21st November to run a workshop for us.  
We will make a fire and sit around it in Woodland Rangers. We will watch and listen to the fire carefully ready to write a poem all about fire.



In History, we will learn about the timeline for the Great Fire of London and how the fire spread. We will think about the methods used to put the fire out and we will compare these to firefighting methods used today.

In Maths, we will be recognising and naming 2D and 3D shapes. We will sort shapes into groups and make patterns with them. You can help us at home by talking about the shapes around you and discussing whether they are 2D or 3D shapes. We will continue to secure our knowledge of numbers 0-10 as well as continuing to count forwards and backwards to 100.

In Religious Education, we will continue to learn about Christianity and the different forms of worship that might take place in churches. We will also find out about the Christmas story. We will perform our Christmas concert to you at The King's Church so that we can see inside a church and compare it to St Edward's Church, that we visited in Reception.

In Science, we will be investigating materials and describing them according to their properties. We will test materials and discuss which materials are best suited for a specific purpose and why. We will continue to record the weather, thinking about how it is changing over the year.

In PE, we will be learning ways to move in dance. We will be playing target games outside.

In Art, we will learn about primary and secondary colours. We will be exploring colour mixing and drawing techniques. We will create a fire picture using the skills we have learnt.

We will be singing in rounds and learning call and response songs in Music. In Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education (PSHE) we will be learning how to stay safe online. We will take part in activities from Good to be Me. This helps children to understand and celebrate their own identities while becoming allies against racism.
