



Our Learning Journey – Fanfares and Fairy Tales
Our Literacy focus this week has been on Fairy Tales– Rapunzel

What we wanted to learn:	What we did:	What could I do at home to help me with my learning?
Literacy To know the features of a fairy tale. To be able to match characters to a well-known fairy tale. To pick out rich language used by author Bethan Woollvin in her version of Rapunzel.	We read different fairy tales in groups and discussed the setting, the good and bad characters and what the problem and resolution of the story is. We also picked out fairy tale language such as 'once upon a time' and 'happily ever after'. We used drama to bring a character from a fairy tale to life. We read Rapunzel and acted out the different parts of the story. We talked about the descriptive language that helped us to act. We recorded this on our working wall so that we can use this language in our writing next week.	You could act out your favourite fairy tales. You could retell the story of Rapunzel to your family. You can compare the two versions we read.
