Reception Reminders

Your child will need a book bag in school every day. These can be purchased from the school office for £4 - cash only. Please do **NOT** send your child with a back pack as there is not room in the corridors for these to hang up. Please make sure you name them.



Please can you also bring in a **NAMED** pair of wellies for your child and put them on the wellie rack in the playground.

Low Income Families - Claiming for low income Free School Meals

All infant school children receive a Universal Free School Meal. However, if you are on a low income your child may be eligible for **pupil premium/low income free school meals** which releases vital funding to the school (£1,510, per year, per eligible child), in addition to over £100worth of benefits from the school, as follows:

- * the Government provides shopping vouchers for school holidays including half terms (approx £10-£15 per child per school holiday week)
- * free school jumper or cardigan per year (usually saving £14-16)
- * free book bag, PE bag, and water bottle per year (saving of £9)
- * free school trips (approx saving of £12-£16)
- * free in-house school clubs (approx saving of £15)
- * free holidays clubs, including meals

Attendance and Punctuality

We would like to remind parents and carers that we are only able to authorise absence in term time in exceptional circumstances which does not include family holidays. If possible, please try to arrange dental appointments for after school or in the holidays.



Arriving on time for school is important as late arrivals are disruptive for the class and can be embarrassing for the child. A child who is late for school is missing out on a very important part of the school day including setting out the context for the work for the day - the classroom doors are opened at 8.50am for the children to come in and start at 8.55am. We want to have all our children in class ready to start the school day promptly and would ask parents for their support in this aim. Thank you.

Reporting a child's absence

If you need to report your child's absence by email (office@thegattons.co.uk) or via the answerphone, can you please ensure you have included your child's full name **AND** class. Thank you. If we do not hear from you by 9.25am, we will ring you to find out why your child is not in school. Any arrival at school after 9.25am is unauthorised (unless it is for a previously authorised reason). Please be aware that 10 unauthorised absences can result in a Fixed Penalty Notice fine which is issued by the Local Authority.

Mobile Phones

Please remember that we have a no phones on the playground policy when you are dropping off and picking up your children. We will remind you politely if you are using them. Please support us with this in safeguarding all of our children.



School Photographs

On Tuesday 30th September the school photographer will be in school to take the children's individual school photos and Reception class photos. We are able to arrange for children to be photographed with siblings (either pre-school or in school) in addition to their individual photo and a letter will be coming home soon regarding this. Please note we cannot do this for children at Southway.



Scooters and Bikes

It is lovely to see so many children coming to school on their scooters and bikes. Please can all children hop off their bikes and scooters once they reach the school gate. This will make sure we are all respecting the right to be safe and cared for. **ALL SCOOTERS AND BIKES MUST BE NAMED** - it is not unusual for several children to have the same model - and should be placed in the appropriate part of the scooter park. Thank you.



TUMMY BUGS!

Please remember that if your child is unwell with sickness and/or diarrhoea for whatever reason, they **MUST** stay away from school until they have been symptom free for a **MINIMUM** of 48 hours. This period of time significantly reduces the risk of the bug spreading throughout the school. We will request that children are collected if we discover they have not been symptom free for 48 hours. Thank you.



Emergency Contacts and Medical Information

An Emergency Contact Form and a Medical Condition Form have been sent home. It is very important that these forms are completed, even if your details remain the same, so that we can check that our records are correct. If you have not already done so, please can you return these forms as a matter of urgency.

We would like to remind parents that we are only able to give prescription medicines to children during the school day and, in the case of antibiotics, only if they have to be taken 4 times a day. All medicines must be brought to the school office and the appropriate paperwork completed. Please do not put medicines of any description in your child's school bag. Thank you.

ParentMail

All the Reception children are on ParentMail. Please ensure that you have activated your account so that you do not miss any important information. Please remember to update your ParentMail details if your email address or mobile number change in addition to letting the school office know. Thank you.

Open Mornings for prospective Reception Children

We will be holding open mornings for the parents/carers of prospective Reception children (September 2026 intake) on various dates in November. Details of the dates and booking links can be found on our website. Please pass this information on to any friends or family that you know have a child due to start school next September. Thank you.


Lunchbox Information

Following new guidance, if you include grapes in your child's lunchbox, please ensure that these are cut into quarters, lengthwise, to avoid them becoming a choking hazard. Please remember **NOT** to include any nuts or nut products, including Nutella and Peanut butter, in your child's lunchbox. Thank you.

*Please help us to help you by ensuring that **ALL** items of clothing, including coats, shoes, gloves, hats and plimsolls are clearly labelled. Please also label book bags, PE bags, water bottles and lunch boxes. Thank you. If labelled items are mislaid, once found, they will be returned to your child's class.*

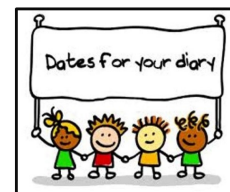
