Our Learning Journey - This week we have been learning about our Solar System

What we wanted to learn	What we did	What I could do at home to help me with my learning
<u>Literacy</u> We have been writing sentences. We have been looking at how we read sentences that have exclamation marks.	We have been reading a book called 'Look up!' The book is all about a little girl called Rocket who loves space. We have been writing sentences about the solar system and about Rocket's adventures. We enjoyed our Space Day on Friday and we learned all about the first ever time humans landed on the moon. Ask us about it and see what we can remember.	I could write a book about the first moon landing. Remember to bring them into school and we can put them in our book corners and read them at the end of the day. I could find out more information about the moon landing.
<u>Mathematics</u> We have been learning about adding 2 numbers together.	We have been adding 2 numbers together. We learned that you can write 4 number sentences from just one picture. $2+3=5$ $3+2=5$ $5=3+2$ $5=2+3$	We can show you what we know! We could play an addition game using dominoes. How quickly can you add the dots together?

Words to practise spelling this week: what when we be me she he

Word aware words: orbit astronaut
You could practise saying this word in a sentence or see if you can spot it in a book.

Maths Mental Fluency: Make the numbers 1 to 10 on your fingers. How quickly can you show the numbers? 7 is 5 plus 2. 9 is 5 plus 4.
