What we wanted to learn	What we did	What I could do at home to help me with my learning
<p>Literacy We wanted to practise our phonics.</p> <p>We wanted to write captions and sentences in Drawing Club.</p>	<p>This half term is all about review and consolidate. We have been reading and spelling lots of words and captions containing sounds we have learnt. We learnt the new harder to read and spell words, 'said', 'so', 'have'.</p> <p>This week we have been reading 'The Tiger Who Came To Tea'. We all enjoyed retelling the story and joining in with repeated phrases. We learnt some new vocabulary and drew The Tiger (character) and The Café (setting). Each drawing needed a secret code to unlock part of an adventure. This was either a word, caption or sentence.</p>	<p>I could practice saying a sentence with the word 'said' in. I could write 'said' really big, really small and using different coloured pens or pencils.</p> <p>I could have a go at the phonics sheet that I am bringing home.</p> <p>I could draw one of the characters from 'The Tiger Who Came to Tea'. I could create my own secret code that will make the Tiger dance!! I could talk to you about the vocabulary that we learnt this week - feast, cautious, slurping, farewell, suddenly and arrive. I could retell the story in my own words.</p>
<p>Mathematics We wanted to count confidently. We wanted to learn to order numbers and identify one more and one less.</p>	<p>We practised counting out loud beyond twenty. We talked about the repeating pattern when counting beyond 20, joining in counting with the pattern of 1s.</p> <p>We rehearsed the order of the first 10 numbers and understood that the position that each number holds in our number sequence does not change. We ordered the Numberblocks and explored that each number has a value one more than the previous number. We used our fingers to show 6 is made of 5 and 1 more and 7 is made of 5 and 2 more.</p>	<p>I could practise counting out loud as far as I can. I could sing the Big Number song https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=eOdJWfQHF8Y</p> <p>You could ask me to show you 6, 7, and 8 on my fingers and say out loud 5 and 1 more makes 6 altogether, 5 and 2 more makes 7 altogether etc..</p> <p>I could draw my own number track placing the numbers 1-10 in the right order.</p>
<p>Science We wanted to learn about animals and their babies.</p>	<p>We thought about different animals and named their babies. We matched pictures.</p>	<p>You could say an animal and I could tell you what their baby is called. I could draw an animal and its baby and then play a matching game.</p>
